
2022 AAG Membership

For more than 100 years since its founding in 1904, the AAG has contributed to the advancement of geography. As an international organization, the AAG promotes discussion among its members and with scholars in related fields. The following report includes the most recent data on the AAG membership based on the information members provide at the time they join the AAG or renew their membership.

Data for AAG members is collected annually on December 31 of that year. As of December 31, 2022, the AAG had 9347 members. The COVID-19 pandemic throughout 2020 undoubtedly affected AAG membership, bringing it to levels similar to 15 years ago. However, between 2021 and 2022, there was a 3.9% increase in membership growth. Membership can be broken down into broad categories of students (which include graduate, undergraduate, and those members with postdocs), retired or long-term members (those who hold a lifetime membership or have been a member for more than 50 years), members from the AAG's Developing Regions program, and Members (an income-based member who do not fall into any of the previously mentioned categories). Data on membership is integral to AAG's commitment to providing world class membership services.




Membership by Cohorts, 2013 - 2022



Student Membership Totals and Category Distribution 2013 - 2022


The distinction between Graduate Students and Postdocs was not made until 2016. Undergraduates were added as their own category in 2017.



Race and Ethnicity

AAG's new join/renew process includes a voluntary question on race/ethnicity. To date, 28.4% of AAG members have answered this question in AAG's new database. 71.60% of AAG members have not answered this question. The largest group of members based on reported race/ethnicity is no response (6692), followed by white, and then by Asian. (Those who did not respond to the question are not included in the visualization below.)

Race/Ethnicity Reported by Members (6692 members did not answer this question)




Gender Identity

AAG's new join/renew process includes a voluntary, open-ended question on gender identity. To date, 21.4% of AAG members have answered this question in AAG's new database (73.84% of AAG members did not disclose their gender identity). The chart below includes all of the open-ended responses reclassified into four categories. (Those who did not respond to the question are not included in the visualization below.)

To compile this graph the following adjustments were made:

Additional Identity is comprised of responses reading "Agender; ALIEN; gender-expansive; Genderfluid; heehee; Male/Nonconforming; she/they; Trans Femme; trans man; transgender."

Female is comprised of "Cis Female; Cis feminine; CIS Woman; Ella; EMale; F; Fem; Femae; Femaie; Femail; Femal; Female; Female(she/her); Female(she/her/hers); Femenin; femini; feminine; feminino; She/Her/Hers; Wo,am; WOMAN; woman (she/her); Woman (she/her/hers); woman she/her; and Women." Male is comprised of "Cis Male; cisgender man; He/Him/His; M; Ma; mail; Maile; Male; man; Masculine; Masculino; Men; Unequivocally Male; and 男."

Non-binary is comprised of "Gender nonconforming; Genderqueer; Non-binary; Non-binary(they, them); non-conforming; and Queer."

International Members


The AAG is an international organization, which is reflected in the fact that over 25% of the AAG membership reports living overseas. While the absolute number of international members has increased over time, the percentage of AAG members who are international has stayed relatively similar.

AAG members can be found across the globe, though the highest numbers of members are found in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, and South Africa. Europe is the region with the highest concentration of international AAG members.



AAG Specialty Groups

The AAG allows for members to select up to 3 Specialty Groups or Affinity Groups to become a participant in when they join or renew their membership. Specialty Groups are interest-based groups, focused on particular areas of study within the broader field. Affinity Groups help connect members with similar backgrounds and experiences.

The following tables include the number of members in each of the specialty and affinity groups. The Specialty Groups have been further subdivided into Methods, Regional, and Systematic Groups. Methods groups focus on methodologies in geography. Regional groups specialize in particular regions of the world. Systematic groups are those that concentrate on one facet of geography. Because members can join multiple groups or choose not to join any groups, the total membership of all the groups is different from the total number of AAG members. The groups with the highest membership include Urban Geography, Graduate Students, Geographic Information Science & Systems, and Cultural and Political Ecology.
